

Arizona Public Law 1003 Right to Travel

We, The Arizona Assembly, a member of The United States of America, unincorporated, with lawful superior concurrent general jurisdictions over land and soil, sea, and air in Arizona, hereby issue a Public Notice to all people that it is declared and recorded by roll call vote, Arizona Public Law 1003.

Arizona Public Law 1003 declares that all Americans exercising their unalienable rights are free to travel on all roadways for noncommercial purposes unencumbered with no requirement for licensing or registration. Said travel shall be performed safely and shall not infringe upon the rights of others.

Furthermore, all corporations and entities operating on our land and soil are liable for any and all activities, and the consequences of those activities, that result in any physical, physiological, or psychological damage by depriving any Arizonan the right to travel. No corporations, entities or their principals will be immune to prosecution for said harmful activities or results of those activities beginning June 1, 2024.

We, Arizonans, are not subject to legislation passed by our employees for the purpose of regulating their own operations.

Any infraction after the first one will be five (5) times the amount of the fee schedule and keep multiplying for every offense, thereafter.

This is concurrent with Public Laws A1010121, A1010224 and A1010124 passed by all 50 states of The United States of America, unincorporated. These public laws apply to all Americans in every state.
