

Arizona Public Law #1009 Right to Privacy and Security

We, The Arizona Assembly(c), a member of The United States of America(c), unincorporated, with lawful superior concurrent general jurisdictions over land and soil, sea, and air in Arizona, hereby issue a Public Notice to all people, that it is declared and recorded by roll call vote, Arizona Public Law 1009.

According to Arizona Public Law 1009, any entity that defies the Fourth Amendment of the Constitution(s) by surveilling Americans in any way by any means, shall be in contempt of common law. This includes but is not limited to any wiretaps or surveillance on phones, televisions, refrigerators, stoves, thermostats, automobile tracking, biometrics, smart meters, smart cities, etc.

The 4th Amendment to the Constitution:

"The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized"

All entities operating on our land and soil, are liable for any and all activities, and the consequences of those activities, that result in any physical, physiological, or psychological damage by depriving Americans of our right to bountiful health as given by our Creator.

We, the People of Arizona, are not subject to legislation passed by our employees for the purpose of regulating their own operations.

This is concurrent with Public Laws A1010121, A1010224 and A1010124 passed by all 50 states of The United States of America(c), unincorporated. These public laws apply to all Americans and U.S. Citizens in every state. This is also concurrent with Arizona Public Laws 1001-1008 published on www.thearizonaassembly.org website.
